

CONSERVANCY REACHES 3,000 ACRES WITH SIGNING OF JENNER CONSERVATION EASEMENT

The Geneva Lake Conservancy is pleased to announce that it has reached its goal of protecting 3,000 acres of open lands with the signing of a 176-acre conservation easement on land owned by Baker and Ginny Jenner. The Jenners own Knolland Farm, an equestrian farm, near Burlington.

The farm has five oak savannas and a rare rolling Kettle Moraine landscape. It has been in the Jenner family since 1986 and includes several horse barns and outbuildings, as well as two homes used by family members. The farm is located east of Lake Geneva and 100 acres are located in Walworth County and 76 acres are in Kenosha County.

Knolland includes 100 acres of prime agricultural land and is adjacent to a 126-acre nature preserve owned by the Seno K/RLT Conservancy, creating a 302-acres of adjacent protected land for wildlife.

"These landscape scale projects, which link protected open lands to create environment corridors for wildlife, are a major goal of the Conservancy," said GLC Chair Kevin Brunner.

Baker and Ginny Jenner worked with the Conservancy over several months to complete the conservation easement that protects further subdivision of the property. The conservation easement also preserves the property's A-1 and A-2 soils that are important to agriculture. These soils are disappearing throughout the Midwest at an alarming rate due to residential and commercial development.

The property also features 36 acres of oak savannas. Oak trees provide the highest carbon storage and sequestration potential in the Midwest. Protection of these oaks will ensure that their carbon storage potential is used to help slow climate change.

Another goal of the conservation easement is to ensure that the Jenner's three daughters and their families as well as future generations could continue to enjoy the land and its scenic beauty.

"The protection of this rare Kettle Moraine landscape from further subdivision and development is a valuable gift to the community," said Kiera Theys, Land Protection Manager.


With the completion of this conservation easement, Geneva Lake Conservancy holds 37 conservation easements and owns 13 properties that protect 3,154 acres of land with high conservation value. Five of its owned properties are public nature preserves with hiking trails and the remaining are protected for wildlife and provide limited public access through guided tours.

While this number is significant, these open lands protect the ecological health of our region, while preserving wildlife habitat and the scenic beauty of Walworth County. "We need to continue our mission to protect more of the remaining open land in Walworth County," said Karen Yancey, Executive Director.

DOUG TALLAMY TO SPEAK AT GLC'S SUMMER EVENT

Douglas Tallamy is a professor of entomology at the University of Delaware. He is a New York Time bestselling author, and has written popular books such as *Bringing Nature Home, Nature's Best Hope*, and *The Nature of Oaks*. He has authored over 80 research articles that revolve around the importance of biodiversity, insect behavior, and the plant-insect relationship.

Known for inspiring landowners to go native, Tallamy advocates for the increase of native plants in yards to help with the decline of biodiversity. In addition to this, he recommends reducing the number of manicured lawns saying "In terms of biological activity, a lawn is the least productive of our plantings, yet it is the default landscaping practice in most spaces."



Douglas Tallamy has said: "Restoring habitat where we live and work, and to a lesser extent where we farm and graze, will go a long way toward building biological corridors that connect preserved habitat fragments with one another."

Tallamy spends his time managing "Homegrown National Park" he cofounded, with the intent to repurpose half of American's lawns for ecology purposes. The Conservancy is excited to bring Tallamy back by popular demand as a guest speaker at its summer event on July 25th at Yerkes Observatory.

SIGN UP FOR THE KEEP IT BLUE PROGRAM


Keep it Blue—a campaign that has been growing in popularity—had its Wisconsin start at Geneva Lake Conservancy in 2023. Since then, fifty landowners have signed the Keep it Blue pledge.

The GLC Keep it Blue program originated as a way to create awareness of the health of local bodies of water and encourage landowners to do their part to care for the Lake. The Conservancy's Keep it Blue program centers around Geneva Lake. In late 2023, Delavan homeowners expressed interest in the program for Delavan Lake, extending the Conservancy's Keep it Blue movement.

Over the past few years, the Conservancy has seen a rise in phosphorous and other nutrient levels in the lake, which ultimately leads to algae blooms. Algae blooms can create a harmful environment for humans, aquatic life, and pets. The health of Geneva Lake and its surrounding watershed affects our local environment, our usage of the lake, and enjoyment of the lake. Because of this, it is pertinent we continue to promote this program and encourage other lakes to participate as well.

They also agree to not use any soap products on their property that may enter the water, and monitor construction sites near their property. Once a landowner signs the pledge, they receive a free Keep it Blue sign to display on their property. The

You don't need a dedicated native garden or large area to be successful in attracting and feeding a variety of songbirds, butterflies, bees and other beneficial pollinators. You can create spaces for ecofriendly plants around your house or among your favorite annuals. These plants are seasonal and many are tall, so they can fill in early spring bare spots or add height and color to the back of your annual garden. All of these native plants need full or partial sun. Each plant will be a healthy 2 - 3 inches tall and ready to plant. Instructions will be included.



FOCUS GROUPS SCHEDULED TO COMPLETE GENEVA LAKE MANAGEMENT PLAN 2024

This year the Geneva Lake Conservancy will be wrapping up the activities needed to complete the Geneva Lake Management Plan Update 2024 by hosting focus groups and completing a second year of counting boat traffic on Geneva Lake.

Two focus groups led by a UW Extension facilitator Eric Olson are planned for May 20 and May 21. The focus groups will concentrate on two issues of most concern to those who responded to a lake-wide survey in 2023. Those issues were water quality and boat traffic, including wakeboarding.

"The goal of the focus groups will be to bring people together on both sides of these issues to agree on solutions," said Tom Nick

issues to agree on solutions," said Tom Nickols, GLC Vice Chair and Co-Chair of the Water Alliance for Preserving Geneva Lake.

The Conservancy will also count boat traffic by using drone technology. The counts will be taken during periods of traditionally high and low boat traffic and compared to boat counts of previous years. Most of the other studies and activities required for the Management Plan Update have been completed.

The Conservancy's partners in gathering the data needed to update the plan include the Geneva Lake Environmental Association, Geneva Lake Association, Walworth County Conservation Office, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, UW-Whitewater, U. S. Geological Survey and the five municipalities that surround Geneva Lake.


The Southeast Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC) is also gathering data and will draft the final report, which will feature recommendations on how to protect the lake's ecological health and recreational uses in the years ahead.

After the report is completed in late 2024, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources will provide a 30-day period for the public to comment on the report. The WDNR comment period will be posted on the Conservancy's Website and all stakeholders in the watershed will be notified via postcard.
